Continuum of Services

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Residential Treatment **Prep Program**

101 participants utilized RTPP this year to prepare for residential treatment.

Let's Grow **Together**

A day program for women who are pregnant/parenting and have questions about how their substance use may affect them, their pregnancy/ parenting, and their children. Utilizes a harm reduction, woman-centered philosophy inclusive of abstinence.

Rapid Access Addiction Medicine Clinics

Digital Front Door – New in 2022! A virtual platform, allowing individuals across Waterloo Wellington to access a RAAM Clinic from their home.

In the first 6 months of operation, Digital Front Door supported:

68 individuals

532 visits with a nurse practitioner or addiction counsellor.



Peer2Peer Overdose Response Program

Connects individuals affected by drug/alcohol poisoning with someone who has relevant lived experience. Through this unique connection, people have a more positive and empowering experience accessing healthcare. The goals of this program are to reduce repeat overdoses, reduce harm from substance use, and educate and support family and friends.

247 of people served.



Addiction Support Coordination

100% of clients said the staff of the program helped them improve their relationships with other services and people.

Specialized Outreach **Services**

Safer Supply Program

Stonehenge opened a Safer Supply Clinic in Mount Forest, improving access to health care for those in rural Wellington who are experiencing harm related to substance use.

I came into this program after being in the hospital for six weeks as a result of my Fentanyl use. Had I continued using the way I was, I most certainly would have died. Safer Supply and the staff who run it, have helped me regain control of my life and continue to help me move forward." - Safer Supply Client
