Accessibility, Belonging and Community Permanent Supportive Housing

10 Shelldale: Housing, Health, and Hope

10 Shelldale is a collaborative initiative between Stonehenge Therapeutic Community, Guelph Community Health Centre, and Kindle Communities that provides permanent supportive housing for individuals who have experienced chronic homelessness and face complex mental health, substance use, and physical health challenges. More than just housing, 10 Shelldale offers 24/7 wrap-around supports that help residents stay housed, build stability, and improve their well-being. It's a place to call home-where people find safety, connection, and a renewed sense of belonging. By combining safe housing with compassionate, integrated care, 10 Shelldale helps individuals reclaim their health and dignity, and creates lasting change for those who need it most.

Kim's Story

My first interaction with Stonehenge was when I entered the residential treatment program in 2006. I learned a lot about myself during treatment and the changes I needed to make in my life. Once I completed the program, I was grateful to be able to access aftercare support and weekend re-grounding at STC as I needed to.

From there I became a member of Stonehenge alumni group, where I was able to support clients going through the same program I did, from the beginning of their journey, to celebrating them at their graduation. I stayed in Guelph when I left STC and would often see residents on their weekly outings from STC coming to the 12 step meetings I attended. This always gave me hope for them.

I have been in recovery since the day I left Stonehenge. Last year, I applied for and was hired as a Peer Support Worker at the new Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) site.

My work at PSH has been a humbling experience. Giving back has been a lifesafer to my recovery. I love that STC offers training and opportunities for advancing in our own life, and also makes sure we care for ourselves along the way.

Stonehenge has helped me from my days at Safe Beds to currently at 10 Shelldale Crescent. I struggle with mental health and addiction issues and have faced homelessness over the last two years. Stonehenge has given me the support I need to find stability mentally, and a beautiful suite to grow in with a team close by to assist me to achieve my life goals.

The residents at Shelldale come from unique, yet similar challenging backgrounds, many of whom would remain chronically unhoused without this support.

Accessibility Digital Front Door

Connecting people to care where they are, and when they need it.

Digital Front Door is a virtual Rapid Access Addiction Medicine (RAAM) clinic in Waterloo Region, Guelph, and Wellington County for people to access quality healthcare and professional guidance, relating to substance use, from a nurse practitioner and an addiction counsellor.

 RAPID ACCESS ADDICTION MEDICINE CLINIC

 The Rapid Access Addiction Medicine clinic (RAAM) is a specialized medical clinic designed for people who are experiencing to the substance use. There is no cost to participate. The RAAM is a short term service and patients are connected back to primary care upon care using substances and who:

Katie's Story

The social distancing requirements of COVID-19 brought about many health care innovations, and telemedicine was one that came to stay.

One example of this is the Digital Front Door (DFD), a virtual platform that allows providers and clients to connect outside of a typical bricks and mortar clinic. This is uniquely beneficial for Stonehenge's Rapid Access Addiction Medicine (RAAM) clinic, which is meant to help people in their earliest moment of need. Removing regular in-person requirements increases our ability to support a vast geographic area, including rural and remote settings, and reduces barriers such as transportation, while providing the flexibility that someone with a more transient lifestyle may require. Patients have even reported feeling a sense of relief at not having to face the stigmatizing crowds in front of a clinic or worry about who they may run into during their visit.

While virtual care may not be for all, it's a great option to have on the menu.

Belonging Peer Support

Peer Support turns shared experience into shared strength.

Belonging begins with "you're not alone—I've been there too."

An important contributor to recovery, Peer Support builds a supportive connection amongst people who share a common or similar experience.

Peer Support Workers, who are embedded in all of our pillars of service at Stonehenge, build and maintain a connection with each other through regular Community of Practice sessions that support their guiding values. The camaraderie that occurs within a team of likeminded individuals creates space for knowledge sharing, learning, and connection that is passed on to clients.

Community Residential Services

Stonehenge's Residential Treatment Program is grounded in the Therapeutic Community (TC) model—an evidencebased approach that views recovery as a holistic, community-driven process.

In a TC, clients live and work together in a structured, supportive environment where the community itself is the catalyst for change. Through shared responsibility, peer support, and daily routines, individuals build healthy relationships, self-awareness, and life skills essential for long-term recovery. As the only publicly funded TC for adults in Ontario, Stonehenge offers a unique and vital space for individuals seeking meaningful, lasting change in their lives.
